What does independent living mean to you? To be able to go in and out of your house as you choose, to go where you want, without concern? Most of us take for granted the ability to come and go as we please, but we recently met a man whose options were much more limited.

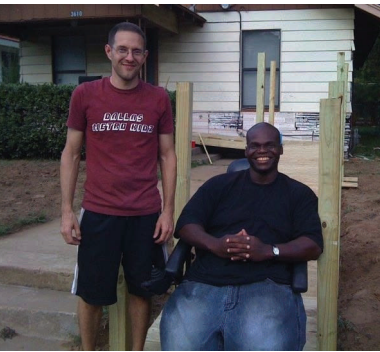


One Saturday afternoon, our staff was in South Dallas, visiting families on their Adopt-A-Block route. As they walked down the street they heard someone calling for help. They found a man sitting in a wheelchair at the bottom of his stairs, unable to get up the makeshift ramp on his own. They helped him up his stairs and spent a few minutes talking with him. His name was Tyrone, and he had an amazing story. Tyrone had been heavily involved in gang activities in his younger days, and because of his activities, he had served a significant sentence in prison, been shot several times and run over twice. Because of his injuries, he had both of his legs amputated above the knee. Since those days, Tyrone had turned his life over to Christ and become a totally different person. We realized that something needed to be done for this man.



We decided that we needed to build him a permanent ramp that would enable him to get in and out of his house on his own. Dallas Metro Dream Center partnered with Dallas Metro Family Fellowship, and on Saturday, October 26 a team that included volunteers from Life Challenge, Gospel Lighthouse and others, arrived at his house to lend a helping hand. Tyrone and his wife sat on the porch the entire time, watching the progress. As each section of the ramp was finished, Tyrone rolled down as far as he could to test it.
